

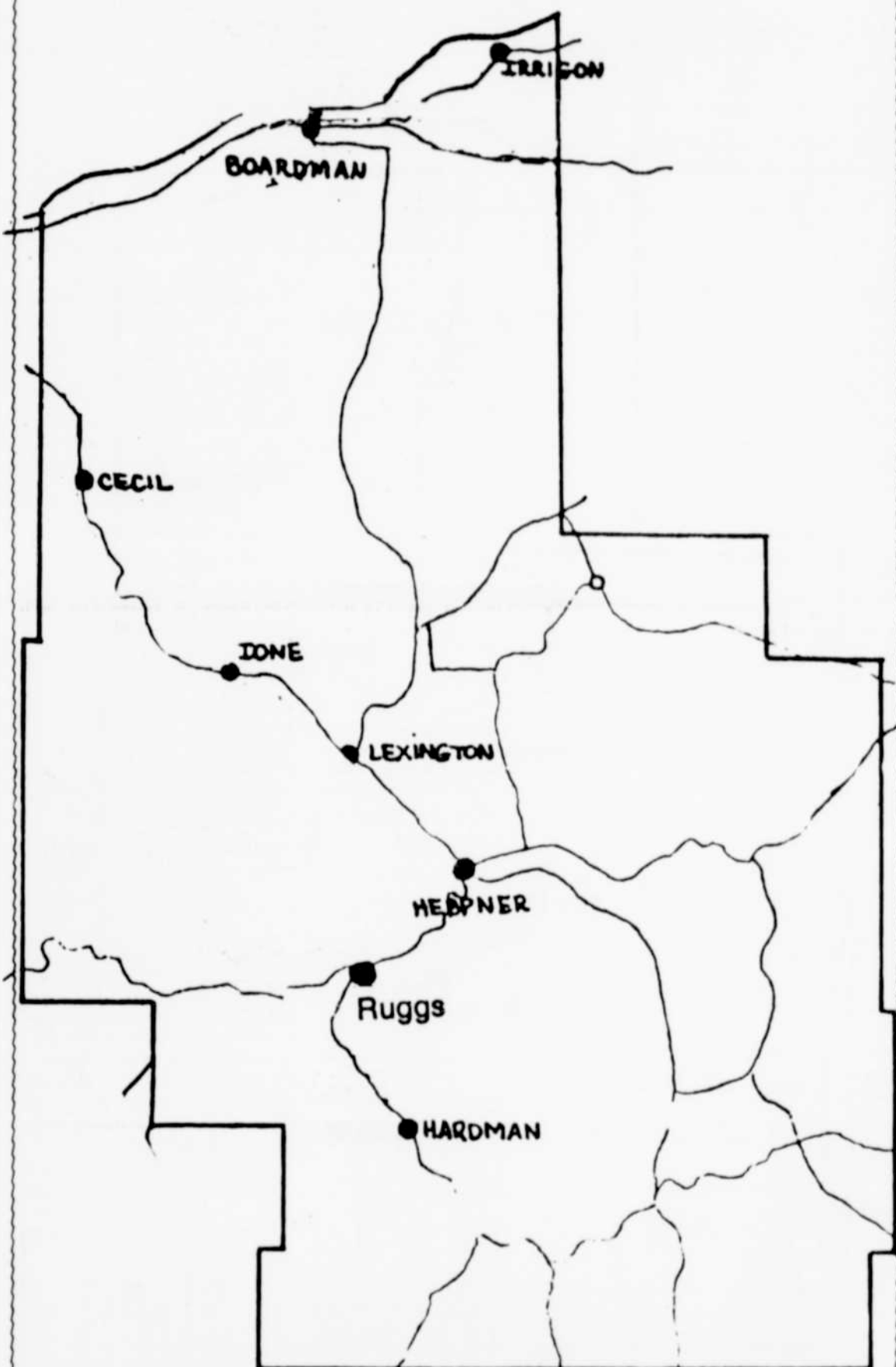

On February 4, 1987, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Robert J. Kilkenny for approval of changes in place of use and point of diversion of water from a well, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 29143, Volume 21, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Robert J. Kilkenny, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second from a well for irrigation of a certain 1.5 ac in NE 1/4 NW 1/4, Sec 29, T1N, R26E, WM, with a date of priority of December 17, 1952.

Water for said right is appropriated from a well located 220'N and 230'W from the Center of Sec 29, being within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Sec 29, T1N, R26E, WM.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the point of appropriation therefrom to a well located 150'S and 470'E from the Center of Sec 21, being within the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Sec 21, T1N, R26E, WM, and to change the place of use to irrigation of 1.3 ac NW 1/4 SE 1/4 and 0.2 ac SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of said Sec 21.

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, March 31, 1987, an election will be held in Morrow County OR. The polls will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. The following shall be the ballot title for the measure submitted to the electors thereof:

ONE YEAR OPERATING LEVY OUTSIDE THE TAX BASE Shall Morrow County Levy \$428,477 outside the tax base for Health Care entities operations for fiscal year 1987-88?

The purpose of this levy is to provide funds to balance the Pioneer Memorial Hospital, North Morrow Medical Clinic, and North Morrow Ambulance operating budgets. The Hospital and Nursing home levy is \$240,304; the North Morrow Medical Clinic levy is \$97,850, and the North Morrow Ambulance levy is \$90,323, which includes seven percent for taxes not expected to be received. The tax rate for the Hospital, Clinic, and Ambulance services will be approximately \$.50 per \$1,000 valuation, which will be included in the total tax rate for Morrow County operations. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Assessor at the time of estimate.

The City needs to borrow about \$400,000 to finish the project. A charter amendment is necessary to allow the City to get a loan for the project. The amendment will allow borrowing up to \$400,000 to be used only for the hotel project.

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, March 31, 1987, an election will be held in Morrow County OR. The polls will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. The following shall be the ballot title for the measure submitted to the electors thereof:

ONE YEAR OPERATING LEVY OUTSIDE THE TAX BASE Shall Morrow County Levy \$2,710,611 outside the tax base for operating purposes for fiscal year 1987-88?

The purpose of this levy is to provide funds to balance the Morrow County operating budget which includes: General Fund; Road Fund; County School Fund; Cities portion of Road Funds; and Fair & Rodeo Fund for fiscal year 1987-88. The tax base for 1987-88 is \$553,320. The total levy will be \$3,720,551, which includes seven percent for taxes not expected to be received, \$28,143 for Lifeguard Medical Transport previously approved by the voters, and \$428,477 for Pioneer Memorial Hospital, North Morrow Medical Clinic, and North Morrow Ambulance submitted to the voters on a separate ballot. The tax rate for this one year operating levy will be approximately \$3.84 per \$1,000 valuation. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Assessor at the time of estimate.
