

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling or dispatching the following business during the past week:

March 2 - dispatched the Boardman ambulance and requested crew respond to the North Morrow Medical Clinic to a possible heart attack. No transport.

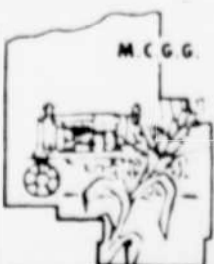
