### Emma Peck

The funeral for Emma P. Peck will be 2 p.m. Thursday at the Lexington Cemetery.

Mrs. Peck, 92, of Heppner, died Sunday at Pioneer Memorial Hospital.

She was born Sept. 15, 1894, in Pierce, Nebraska, the daughter of Hiram and Mary Riley Millett.

She spent most of her school years in California, where she earned a degree in botany from Stanford University. She taught at Lexington High School in 1917 and 1918.

In June, 1918 she married George N. Peck at Sunnyvale, Calif.

Mrs. Peck lived the greater part of her life in Lexington until moving to Pendleton in 1953. The past three years she has been a resident of Heppner.

Her lifelong hobby was gardening. She enjoyed making things grow, both flowers and vegetables.

Mrs. Peck was a member of the Pendleton Presbyterian Church and Pauline Rebekah Lodge of Pendleton.

Survivors include a son, Kenneth of Lexington; sister, Etta Wilson of Roseburg; six grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren.

Her husband and a son, Ellwynne, died earlier.
