

# Wilgers paces Heppner tracksters

Clean skies and some good performances highlighted a triangular meet for the Heppner tracksters Tuesday, March 31.

The boys team tied for first with Elgin with 66 points while Mac Hi had 37 points.

Heppner's girls finished third in the meet with 39 points. Elgin took the girls race with 69 points followed by Mac-Hi with 51 points.

The boys scored 38 points in the field events to offset a 43-28 disadvantage in the running events while the girls team earned all but 9 of their points in the running events.

Wayne Wilgers paced the boys team with a first in the high jump (6-4), second in the long jump (a personal best 19-6½), and second in the triple jump (38-8½).

Throwers Gene Lancaster and Jason Palmer captured the shot put and discus respectively. Lancaster won in a personal best throw of 45-0½ and Palmer threw 125-1 to win his speciality. Palmer was also second in the shot with a put of 42-7¼.

Ashley Conklin won both horizontal jumps, leading 19-11 in the long jump and 39-6 in the triple jump.

Sprinters Barney Lindsay and Jim Brosnan were second and third in the 100-meter dash respectively in times of :11.9 and :12.2, both personal best.

Lindsay won the 200 in :24.8 with Brosnan third in :25.3. The two then teamed with Ed Hamlin and Trent Harrison to clock 3:57.8 in the 1,600-meter relay and place second.

Bryan Padberg was first in the 3,000-meter run in a time of 9:40. He was also second in the 800-meter run with a time of 2:07.6.

Hamlin was second in the 400-meter dash, sprinting the distance in 1:02.2 while Harrison covered the 1,500 meters in 4:48.1 for third.

Jumper Duane Ball rounded out the boys scoring with third places in the high jump (5-0) and triple jump (28-8½).

Kim Stookey led the girls with a first place in the 1,500 in 5:58 and a second in the 100-meter high hurdles in :19.0. Stookey was also

on the first place 1,600-meter relay of Kim Sager, Nancy Bailey, and Jill Conklin that ran 5:06.

Bailey won the 400 with a time of 1:15.7 and Sager was third in both the 100 and 200 in times of :13.8 and :30.1 respectively.

Sager, Dorothy Hays, Tami Lindsay, and Sandi Turner also were third in the sprint relay with a showing of :57.0.

Hays was third in the high hurdles in :19.4 and Turner was third in the high jump at a height of 4-8 and was fourth in the long jump with a leap of 13-1.

Jill Conklin also placed in both jumps. She was fourth in the high jump at 4-6 but grabbed third in the long jump at 13-5.

Michelle Beck and Shannon McLaughlin rounded out the girls scoring with three second place performances.

Beck completed the 800 and 3,000 in times of 3:07.9 and 13:56 respectively for her place finishes and McLaughlin heaved the shot 24-1½ for her second place finish.
