The Economic Development Department stated that the lottery officials indicated another \$45,000 to \$50,000 may be deposited in June but that was still uncertain, Currin said.

It is vital for fairs to contact their legislators encouraging continuance of this program, she said. The Morrow County Fair Board has been in touch with Rep. Ray French and Sen. Gene Timms regarding the continuation of the lottery program.
