

Thinclads finish first in spite of weather

Midst rainy and windy conditions last Tuesday, Heppner's boys track team won its own five-way meet

with 96½ points while its girls team was third with 35 points.
A heavy rain pounded for approximately 20 minutes which left the under track soft and slow.

Despite the weather, Heppner's boys once again used its dominance in the field events to win the meet while its girls were forced to perform without Dorothy Hays and Sandi Turner.

Following Heppner in the boys race was lone, 74½ points; Condon, 40; Pilot Rock, 13; and Wheeler County, 0.

Pilot Rock won the girls team race with 72 points followed by lone with 49 points. Condon had 16 points and Wheeler County 7.

Leading the boys were Ashley Conklin and Jason Palmer. Conklin won the long jump with a season's best of 20-2 and the triple jump with a mark of 39-1¼. He was also second in the 300-meter hurdles in :49.8 and was on the second place 400-meter relay team of Jason Dougherty, Wayne Wilgers, and Barney Lindsay which clocked :50.6.

Palmer won the discus with a toss of 121-6 and was second in the shot put with a heave of 42-3. Palmer also sprinted the 200-meter dash in :28.6 for fourth.

Wilgers won the high jump at 5-8 and Dougherty was first in the 100-meter dash in :12.1.

Wilgers combined with Conklin to lead a 1-2-3-4 Heppner sweep in the long jump by placing second at 18-11 and Dougherty was third in the 200 in :26.1. The 1,600-meter relay team of Lindsay, Jim Brosnan, Bryan Padberg, and Dougherty were also first in 4:12.5.

Lindsay was second in the 200 in a time of :25.8 and was third in the long jump with a jump of 18-0 ¾. Gene Lancaster put the shot 47-8 for first and was second with a toss of 111-10 in the discus.

Padberg won the 800-meter easily in 2:12 and tied for fourth in the 400-meter dash in 1:01.5. In the same event, Brosnan was second in 1:00.2.

Also having a good day for the boys was Duane Ball who set two personal bests and tied another.

Ball was second in the javelin in a best of 133-4 and was fourth in the long jump with a best of 17-9. He tied his best in the high jump at 5-6 for third.

Picking up the rest of the boys points were Ed Hamlin, fifth in the 100 at :13.5 and Dean Munkers, fifth in the javelin at 85-1.

Leading the girls were Kim Stookey who won the 3,000-meter run in 12:58.8 and was second in the 100-meter high hurdles in :19.6. Also in the distance events, Michelle Beck was second in both the 800 (3:07.1) and the 1,500 (6:25).

Competing in the jumps, Jill Conklin won the long jump with a personal best of 14-5 and grabbed third in the high jump at 4-0.

Running the low hurdles for the first time ever, Kim Sager was second in :56.9.

Mustangs bow to Pirates

A lack of hitting plagued Heppner's baseball team last Saturday in the doubleheader against Riverside and as a result the Mustangs dropped out of Columbia Basin Conference action.

Heppner lost the opener 8-1 and then lost 5-2 in the second game.

With the loss the Mustangs fell to 8-6 in league play while Riverside improved to 10-4 in league play in the second spot in the CBC Eastern Division.

John Kenny went 5-7 for the day for Heppner but as a team Heppner collected only five hits in the opener and only six hits in the nightcap of the doubleheader.

Mustang skipper Steve Wicks was puzzled by his team's inability to hit the ball.

"We usually always hit the ball better," Wicks said, "but you have to give Riverside's pitchers some credit."

John Klennert went the distance for the Pirates in the first game with nine strikeouts and just one walk.

Freshman Scott Timms pitched the nightcap and struck out a dozen Heppner hitters and walked none. "He's a good, young pitcher," Wicks said of Timms.

The Mustangs got to Klennert early but were unable to score as they stranded six base runners in the first three innings.

Klennert got tougher as the game went on, striking out six in the final four innings.

Kenny went 3-4 in game one with Heppner's only run while Craig Angell was 2-3 with a run batted in.

Troy Hyatt started for the Mustangs and was tough early on before the Pirates reached him for three runs in the third inning. Hyatt finished the game with seven strikeouts.

Mark Tallman, Riverside's number nine hitter, was 2 for 2 in the first game while Boyd Davis and Matt Nuttbrock each pounded doubles.

In the second game Riverside

scored twice in the first inning, once in the third frame, and twice more in the fifth inning to lead 5-0.

Angell led off with a single and later Kenny rapped a double to put two Mustangs in scoring position.

Russell Britt then drove in Angell and Joe Taylor singled to score Kenny as Heppner pulled within 5-2.

Taylor was 2 for 3 in the nightcap and Hyatt had a double.

The Mustangs had Tuesday off and will host Umatilla on Saturday in a doubleheader starting at 11 a.m.

Heppner will then host Weston-McEwen next Tuesday at 4 p.m. and will close out the season next Friday at Pilot Rock at 4:30 p.m.

Cardinals compete at "B" meet

The lone thinclads traveled to Gresham, Saturday, May 2 for the State "B" Invitational track and field meet. Thirty-three schools were represented with only participants who had met a qualifying standard participating.

The lone girls finished in a fifth place tie and the boys finished 17th. Competition in the boys events was especially tough.

In girls competition Deena Hams was the high scorer with 24 points, finishing second in the javelin with a toss of 131'9", second in the discus with a throw of 101'8", and second in the shot put with a 33'1" heave. Katie Doherty recorded two personal bests by running the 1500 meter in 5:49.4, bettering her time by 15 seconds, a good for sixth place. In the 3000 meter run she bettered her best time by a full 40 seconds to run 12:49.0 for third place. Mary Cupps finished sixth in the high jump with a leap of 4'8", ran 20.9 in the high hurdles and 56.3 for a school record in the intermediate hurdles.

Jo Cupps did not place but jumped 4'4" in the high jump and competed in the javelin and discus. In the boys meet points were hard to come by, but Robert Adams finished fourth in the shot with a heave of 42'10". Gary Rea uncorked a throw of 114'1" for a personal best and fifth in the discus. Dustin Padberg tied for sixth in the high jump at 5'6".

The 400 meter relay team of Robert Adams, Sean Warren, Dustin Padberg, and Dick McElligott finished sixth with a season best time of 48.0. Other personal records were recorded by Dick McElligott and Brian Ball in the 400 meters. Chris Rea with a jump of 10'6" in the pole vault, and the 1600 meter relay team composed of Brian Ball, Dustin Padberg, Chris Rea, and Dick McElligott ran a season's best of 3:51.4 improving by eight seconds.

Next action for the Cardinals will be the Big Sky Conference meet in Condon on Saturday, May 9. Both teams will be shooting to bring home a first or second place trophy.
