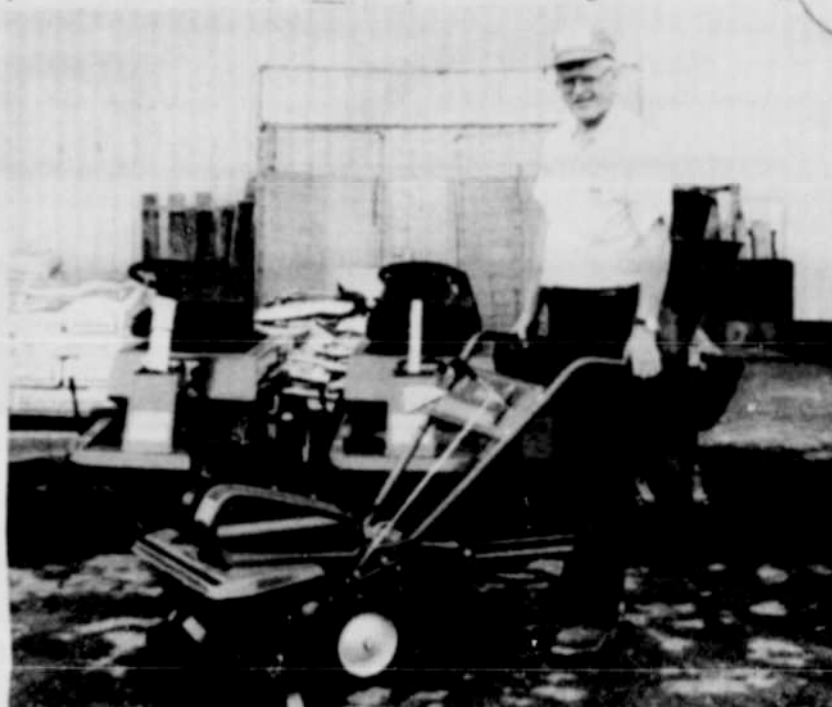
Game players will use scrip for the games throughout the night and then use the scrip to buy prizes at the midnight auction.

## Fire season begins Friday

The Central Oregon District of the Oregon Forestry Department has announced that Fire Season will go into effect on Friday, May 15. Logging operators will be required to have fire equipment in place on each operation. In addition, Burning permits will be required for all burning within the District.

The Central Oregon District consists of forest lands in Wheeler, Gilliam, Morrow, Wasco, Hood River, Deschutes, Crook, Jefferson,
