

# Mustang golfers downed

Heppner's boys golf teams found the talent of Enterprise and Class "AAA" Hermiston too much to overcome last Thursday at the Willow Creek Country Club.

Hermiston with 298 strokes for 18 holes defeated both the Savages, who had 321 strokes, and the Mustangs, which had 349 strokes.

Enterprise's Steve Cavallaro was medalist on the afternoon with a career-best 68.

The Bulldogs of Hermiston also prevailed in the junior varsity match with a 118 for nine holes compared to the 136 for Heppner's JV Blue and 158 for its JV Gold squad.

"Hermiston showed the skill and strength of being from a Class 'AAA' school," Heppner coach John Edmundson said.

Despite finishing third, Heppner received good rounds from Carl Martin and Jim Clark who fired scores of 77 and 85 respectively.

"Carl Martin and Jim Clark shot good, steady rounds," Edmundson said.

"At the JV level," Edmundson added, "Dan Struthers showed that he has recovered from his wrist injury and is ready to resume playing well. Bert Cason also shot a good round."

Struthers, Heppner's top player a year ago, has been hampered by a nagging wrist injury this season, but did fire a 38 while Cason chipped in a 43 to lead Heppner's JV Blue team.

Hermiston's Chris Halsey was the JV medalist with a 37.
