Going head to head against the golf teams from Mac-Hi and Riverside last Friday at the Milton-Freewater Golf Course, Heppner's golf teams finished third in the three-way meet.

Playing just nine holes in both the boys and girls competitions, Mac-Hi was first in the boys race with 148 strokes followed by Riverside with a 168 and Heppner at 173.

Riverside won the girls match with 206 strokes with Mac-Hi second at 214 and Heppner next with 227.

Mac-Hi's Wes White, with an even par 30, was the boys medalist while Theresa Meade of Riverside and Teresa Smith of Mac-Hi sharing girls medalist honors with a 43.

Bert Cason stroked a 41 and Dan Struthers chipped in with a 43 to place the Heppner boys.

Leading the Heppner girls was Sheila Piper who had a 47.

Heppner's girls traveled to Boardman to play Riverside on Tuesday while those two boys teams will meet in Heppner at 3 p.m. on Thursday.

Following those matches, the Heppner boys will travel to Pendleton on Saturday to play the Pendleton JVs at 1 p.m.

Tuesday's girls match will be the Heppner girls final preparation before the district golf meet which will be held Monday May 11, and Tuesday May 12, at the Crooked River Ranch near Redmond.

A combination of good defense, good hitting, and good pitching, paced Heppner's baseball team to an 8-1 victory over the Weston-McEwen Tiger Scots last Tuesday afternoon.

The Mustangs committed no errors on the day, received good pitching from Craig Angell, and pounded out 11 hits.

Angell went the distance on the mound for Heppner allowing six hits and striking out seven, including the side in the seventh inning.

At the plate, Mark Fishburn went 2-2 with two runs batted in to lead Heppner.

Joe Taylor was 2-3 and scored two runs as the Mustangs blew open the game with six runs in the third inning.

Russell Britt led off with a double and after Angell walked, David Pedro reached on an error. RBI-singles by John Kenny and Bob Riehl aided the Mustang cause, as did a sacrifice by Fishburn giving Heppner a 7-0 lead.

Angell allowed three singles which produced a run for the Mustangs in the fifth but shut Weston-McEwen down from there. Britt and Pedro each added two hits for Heppner.

Heppner coach Steve Wicks was pleased with the win. "Craig pitched well for us and our defense did a good job of backing him up," he said.

Mustangs finish season in third

Heppner's baseball team ended its season in fine fashion last Friday by pulling out a 7-6 win over the Columbia Basin Conference Eastern Division champions, the Pilot Rock Rockets.

With the win, the Mustangs ended up in third place in the CBC's Eastern Division with a 12-6 league record and 12-7 overall mark.

Heppner led the Rockets 5-1 going into the bottom of the sixth inning but Pilot Rock scored five unanswered runs to lead 6-5.

But in the top of the seventh, the Mustangs scored two runs to pull out the win.

Bob Riehl led off the inning by reaching on an error and advanced to second on an infield out.

Dick Devin then scored Riehl with a bunt-single and later scored on a double by Troy Hyatt.

Craig Angell allowed three singles in the bottom half of the inning but no Rocket runs were scored as Heppner won, with Angell improving his record to 6-2.

Devin, Russell Britt, and John Kenny each went 2 for 4 at the plate to lead the Mustangs. Britt scored twice and stole two bases.

Dennis Deno was 3-3 for Pilot Rock and Scott Miller was 3-4. Each had three singles.

The Rockets out hit Heppner 12-8 and struck out four more batters, 11-7, but still lost.

Kenny and David Pedro, both seniors, led the Mustangs with average of .484 and .396 respectively. Kenny also led the team in hits (31), runs scored (23), and stolen bases (18).

Riehl paced first-year coach Steve Wicks' team with 19 RBI while hitting .328.

Others with high batting averages were Mark Fishburn (.370) and Britt (.362) while Angell and Hyatt led the pitching staff.

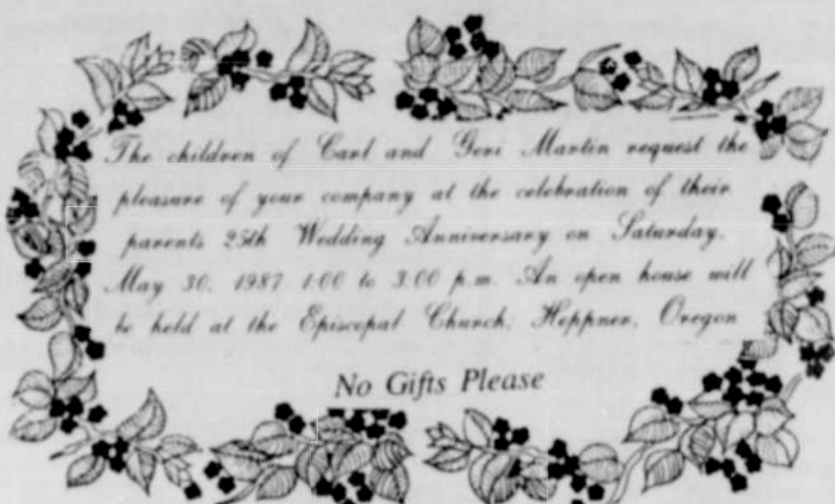
