Hams qualifies for state

Deena Hams was the lone state qualifier from Ione at district track meet May 15-16 at Wahtonka.

She participated in the javelin throw May 22 in Springfield.

Both the lone boys and girls teams finished in eighth place at the district meet. The girls scored 29 points, up from 26 last year and the boys scored 16, up considerably from last year's 6 1/2.

Placing for the girls Hams set a new district record in the javelin of 125' for first place. She placed fifth in the shot put at 31' 6" and third in the discus with a new school record of 104' 6 1/2".

Mary Cupps jumped 4' 6" in the high jump and ran a personal best of 19.37 in the 100 meter hurdles for fifth place. Jo Cupps threw a personal best of 191' 4 1/2" in the discus for sixth place. Katie Doherty placed fifth in the 3000 meter to round out the girls scoring.

In boys action, Dustin Padberg was the high scorer with 5 1/2 points. He finished fourth in the high jump at 5' 4" and sixth in the triple jump at 37' 1 1/2". He also ran a leg of the 400 meters relay which placed fifth

with the year's best time of 47.78. Robert Adams threw the shot put 43' 9 1/2" for fourth place and ran a leg of both relays.

Sean Warren placed sixth in the 100 meter with a personal best of 12.13, and ran a leg of the 400 meter relay.

Gary Rea threw the discus 110' 2" for sixth place.

Chris Rea vaulted 9' for sixth place.

The fourth member of the 400 meter relay team was Dick McElligott who along with Adams, Brian Ball, and Kevin Ball finished sixth in the 1600 meter relay.

A REMINDER
Constitution of Oregon
Article 1 - Bill of Rights
Section 1. Natural rights inherent in people.
