Upper Willow Creek power line relocated

Hawkeye Construction, Inc. of Redmond, is nearing completion of relocating 1.2 miles of distribution power line along Willow Creek road 11 miles south of Heppner. Relocation of the power line is funded by the Federal Highway Administration in conjunction with the Oregon Forest Highway Project on Willow Creek road. The power line relocation is a pre-requisite to the highway project.

Fred Toombs, Manager of Columbia Basin Electric Cooperative, Inc., indicated that the design and field work for the relocated line section was completed by Mark Lovgren, system engineer, and Bill Gentry, line superintendent. Toombs said "We're pretty busy with the projects we have going." This is somewhat like harvest for us."

Classes are offered for children from age 2 1/2 through those entering sixth grade. A \$1 donation is asked for each student for the week to help defray the cost of books and supplies.

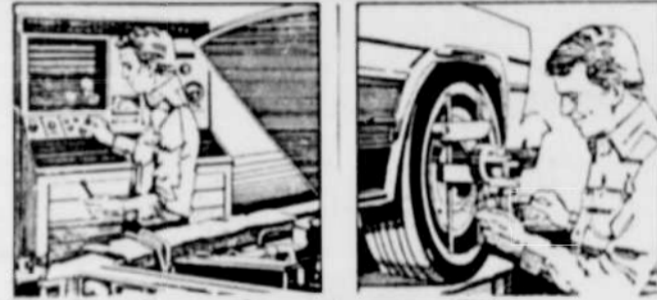
