Irl W. Terry

Irl William "Jack" Terry, 93, of Twain Harte, Calif., formerly of Ukiah, died Saturday, May 23, 1987, at a hospital in Twain Harte.

He was a native of Ukiah and had lived in Manteca, Calif., for 45 years before moving to Twain Harte 17 years ago.

He was a self-employed craftsman and inventor of farm equipment for 50 years.

Terry won Northwest bronco riding championships from 1921 to 1924. He was a Heppner resident for several years and participated in the Morrow County Rodeo. He was parade grand marshal in 1972.

After retiring from rodeo, he became a blacksmith and invented and patented farm implements, such as a bean cutter, planter, and hay loader attachments for tractors.

Survivors include his wife, Gene, of Twain Harte; sons, Wayne of Pioneer, Calif., and Robert of Sacramento; a sister, Norma Garris of Pendleton; three grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.
