# Babe Ruth team 5-4 on season

As the 13-15 year-old Babe Ruth baseball season comes to a close, the South Morrow County squad comprised of Heppner and lone players, is fighting to end the season with an above 500 record.

Following an 11-1 victory over Condon last Wednesday, the South Morrow County club stands at 5-4. The 10-run rule was invoked and the game called after the fifth inning because South Morrow County had a 10-run lead.

The South Morrow County team scored six runs in the bottom of the third inning en route to the victory.

Casey Pedro sparked the victory by going 2-3 at the plate with a pair of singles, runs, and stolen bases.

Eric Connor got the victory on the mound by pitching a one-hitter in going the distance.

Tom Kenny and Bob Krien also stroked run-scoring doubles in the game.

On the season, the South Morrow County team has been led by Kenny, Pedro, and Slater Mitchell, all 15-year-olds.

Kenny has had an exceptional season at the plate, hitting at a .539 clip with 14 hits in 26 at bats. He also leads the team with 12 runs scored.

Mitchell is 11 of 28 at the plate for a .393 average and has seven runs batted in.

Pedro is second on the team in runs scored (11), and sports a .296 batting average with nine walks as well.

As a team, South Morrow County is hitting .239 and has scored an average of 7.6 runs per game.

Connor meanwhile has been the ace of the staff with a 4-2 record on the mound. Kyle Broderick and Jim Kindle have also provided South Morrow County with strong pitching throughout the year.

On Wednesday, South Morrow County will travel to Umatilla to play the Umatilla Blue team at 6 p.m.

South Morrow County is 2-0 against the Umatilla Blue club this season with wins of 8-5 and 12-7. On Saturday, the South Morrow

County club will travel to Boardman for a doubleheader starting at 11 a.m.
