Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office at the Courthouse in Heppner reports handling or dispatching the following business during the past week:

June 27: the sheriff's office responded to a Heppner business to assist the Heppner Police Dept. with an interview.

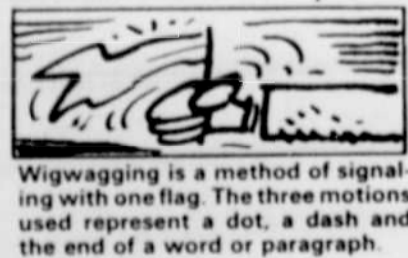
June 27: the sheriff's office responded to assist Boardman police attempt to locate a car prowler.

Helen Keithly, 70, of Heppner, died Wednesday, June 24, 1987, at St. Anthony Hospital in Pendleton. She was born June 28, 1916 at Lone, daughter of Thomas and Ida Hale Gragill. She attended school at lone for 12 years and married Everett O. Keithly on June 3, 1935 at lone.

The couple lived at lone for two years until 1937 when they moved to Baker, returning to lone briefly in 1945, then settling in Heppner. They lived at Condon from 1962-1967 then returned to Heppner.

She was a member of the Eastern Star, Rebekah's, Pythian Sisters and the United Methodist Church.

Survivors include her husband at the home; son, Vern of Heppner; daughters, Janet Kloepfel, Vernal, Utah, Sharon Harrison, of Lexington and Tricia Sweeney, of Heppner; sisters, Hazel Ellis of lone and Anna Wright of Baker; 14 grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.
