South Morrow County then ended its season with an even 6-6 record after being swept by Boardman Saturday in a doubleheader. Boardman won the first game 12-2 in a game limited to six innings because of the 10-run rule, and also won the nightcap 11-4.

Pitchers Matt Andreason and Scott Timms limited South Morrow County to three hits in the opener, singles to Jason Britt and Casey Pedro and a double to Slater Mitchell.

In the second game, South Morrow County was again limited to three hits, a pair of singles by Brandon Pedro and a double by Eric Connor.

Boardman pitchers also struck out 10 South Morrow County batters in each game.

On the season, Tom Kenny led the team in hitting with a .444 average, followed by Mitchell with a .371 average.
