NOTICE OF SERVICE OF PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX WARRANTS

NOTICE is hereby given pursuant to ORS 311.615 of the service of Personal Property Tax warrants upon the following listed tax payers. Payment of the following listed delinquent taxes with interest and cost of service must be made by July 8, 1987 or said warrants shall be filed with the County Clerk of Morrow County, Oregon, for entry in the County Clerk Lien Record, and shall become a lien upon the title to any interest in real property owned by the person against whom the warrant is issued, and the taxes on personal property embraced in the warrant with interest, penalties and costs applicable thereto, shall continue as a lien on all the personal property of the person assessed as otherwise provided by law. The effect shall be the same as though the people of the county had recovered the judgement against the person charged for the full amount of the delinquent tax covered by the warrant together with interest thereon and cost as provided by law.

Fishermen below McNary dam have been catching some nice Walleye along with a few Sturgeon. You may want to give that a try over the Fourth of July weekend.

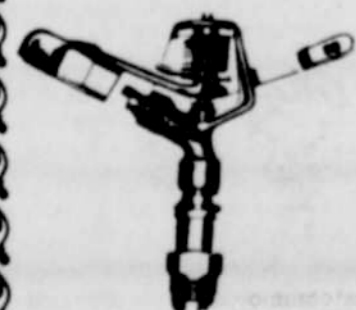

Summerlike temperatures in April may be partly to blame for the loss of thousands of Spring Chinook and Coho Smolts released high in the Umatilla River system.

Irrigators pulling water at Westland Diversion, a couple miles upstream from Echo, are leaving the Smolts either high and dry or impinged on the out-dated screening system, said Don Sampson, Fish biologist for the confederated tribes of the Umatilla Indian reservation.
