Has fond memories of Heppner

To the Editor:

Although brother Jack and I spent only six years in Heppner living at grandmother's house, it remains the home of our hearts. A kaleidoscope of memories flood back at the thought of a reunion. The shared fun of the Heppner Rodeo and dances, our great band and Harold Buhman, the Pendleton Roundup, football, basketball, track, tennis, school plays and the prom. It was a special time in a small town of rural Oregon during the great depression, but babysitting, selling magazine subscriptions and passing out handbills kept me financially afloat, and provided Saturday night movie money. The fun shared with many neat friends, taffy pulls, harvest time on ranches, trips to the Blues, parish hall, Elks and school dances, crazy Halloweens, parties at the Wilsons, and horseback riding.

The great teachers who became special friends-Juanita Leathers Carmichael, Henry Tetz, Norbert Peavy, Alden Blankenship, to name a few, made our schooldays memorable and fun.

We had wonderful friends and neighbors-Ball, Blake, Barratt, Barlow, Ashbaugh, Doolittle, Blakey, Cohn, Green, Gilliam, Gilman, Ferguson, Howell, Chin, Crawford, Hayes, Hager, Healy, Jones, Parrish, Knotson, Thompson, Turner, Nickerson, O'Donnell, Van Marter, Tambllyn, Skuzeski, Merrill, Prock, McMurdo, McCaleb, Morton, Dinges, McCurdy, Lieualten and others.

Heppner is also our "roots" place, as that part of Oregon our families pioneered. Dad, John Franklin Vaughn, was born at Eight Mile in 1883. His parents, Franklin and Carrie Vaughn, and her parents, the Allison's, had a donated Land

Claim to homestead and raise wheat. The Nez Perce made their annual trek to the Blues through their property. The Allison's and Vaughn's are buried in the Heppner cemetery. Mother, Muriel Cason, was born in Ione in 1982 and her parents, Walter and Sarah Hale Cason are buried in the Ione cemetery. Mother's grandmother was Mary Marsh Cason, child survivor of the Whitman Massacre, who with her husband James, ranched in Cason Canyon.

During our lives we have seen the growth of aviation from the transatlantic flight of Charles Lindbergh, to satellites and space exploration, and jumbo jets to transport us throughout the world; hydroelectric power...the wonder of Bonneville (and loss of Celilo Falls), to atomic power and the nuclear age. What a great distance the world has moved from the simple and tranquil days of growing up in Heppner.
