## Heppner woman attends celebration

Mary Goheen of Heppner recently attended the 50th anniversary celebration of the first polar flight from Moscow to Vancouver, Washington. She had also attended, with her husband, the celebration following the plane's landing June 20, 1937.

The considerable collection of articles and pictures that she had kept for fifty years was honored by the leaders of the anniversary celebration; copies of her collection of articles were displayed at the Marshall House Museum and were given to the granddaughter of the co-pilot who still lives, and will be taken to him in Russia.

The impressive monument at Vancouver is named after the chief pilot of the historic flight, Valeri Chkalov, who died a year later while testing a new Soviet plane. The cover of the souvenir packet containing the banquet menu and the concert program, features this quotation by Chkalov: "The Columbia River and the Volga River are located on different continents. Though each has a disposition and a character of its own and the banks of each are surrounded by different mountains and forests, they flow on the same planet without interfering with one another. Ultimately they merge into one and the same World Ocean. Our peoples--the people of the Soviet Union and of the United States--should live in the same world in peace. Our joint efforts should beautify the ocean of human life."
