tracts. When an assessment is not paid, counties have collected them by placing an addition onto the landowner's property tax. But since this type of collection can be affected by an appeal for a valuation made by another party, an irrigation district sometimes may not receive its full assessment.

Now irrigation districts will be able to collect assessments owed to them so that they can pay off their debts.

"I'm pleased to see this bill pass," said French. The bill passed in the House by a vote of 49-0.

NOTICE is hereby given pursuant to ORS 311.615 of the service of Personal Property Tax warrants upon the following listed tax payers. Payment of the following listed delinquent taxes with interest and cost of service must be made by July 8, 1987 or said warrants shall be filed with the County Clerk of Morrow County, Oregon, for entry in the County Clerk Lien Record, and shall become a lien upon the title to any interest in real property owned by the person against whom the warrant is issued, and the taxes on personal property embraced in the warrant with interest, penalties and costs applicable thereto, shall continue as a lien on all the personal property of the person assessed as otherwise provided by law. The effect shall be the same as though the people of the county had recovered the judgement against the person charged for the full amount of the delinquent tax covered by the warrant together with interest thereon and cost as provided by law.
