



Winter wheat production forecasts down

Winter wheat production in Oregon, based on conditions as of July 1, 1987 is expected to total 49.5 million bushels this year according to the Oregon Agricultural Statistics Service. If realized, that production would be 8% below the 1986 crop and 5% below 1985. Acres for harvest are now estimated at 750,000 acres, 19% less than last year. The previous record high bushels per acre this year, up eight bushels from last year. The previous record high yield was set in 1984 at 63.0 bushels per acre. Nationally, winter wheat production is forecast at 1.57 billion bushels, 4% above the 1986 production.

Oregon's spring wheat planted acreage, at 65,000 acres this year, is down sharply from the 100,000 acres planted last year. Acres for harvest are also down sharply from 95,000 acres in 1986 to 60,000 acres this year. U.S. spring wheat planted acreage is estimated at 13.5 million acres, 11 percent below 1986. Area for harvest, at 13.1 million acres, is 10% below a year earlier.

Acres planted to barley totaled 250,000 acres, down 125,000 from last year. Acres for harvest are also expected to be down from 365,000 acres in 1986 to 220,000 acres in 1987. Nationally, barley planted acreage totals 11.0 million acres, and harvested area is estimated at 10.1 million acres.

Oregon growers planted 90,000 acres of oats this year compared with 140,000 last year. Oat acreage expected to be harvested for grain is estimated at 60,000 acres, compared with 80,000 harvested in 1986.

Field corn planted for all purposes this year is estimated at 55,000 acres, down 5,000 acres from last

year and 15,000 acres below 1985. Acres of corn for harvest as grain are expected to total 25,000 acres, 5,000 acres below 1986.

Oregon's fall potato acreage for harvest this year is expected to total 55,000 acres, up 6% from last year's harvested acreage. Malheur county potato growers are expecting to harvest 6,800 acres, the same as last year.

Bartlett pear production in Oregon for 1987 is forecast at 72.0 thousand tons as of July 1, up 3% from the June 1 forecast and 31 percent more than last year's small crop. Production in the three Pacific Coast States (California, Oregon and Washington) is expected to total 517 thousand tons, 11% more than 1986 and 10% more than 1985.

Winter pear production for 1987 in Oregon is forecast at 120 thousand tons as of July 1. This first forecast
