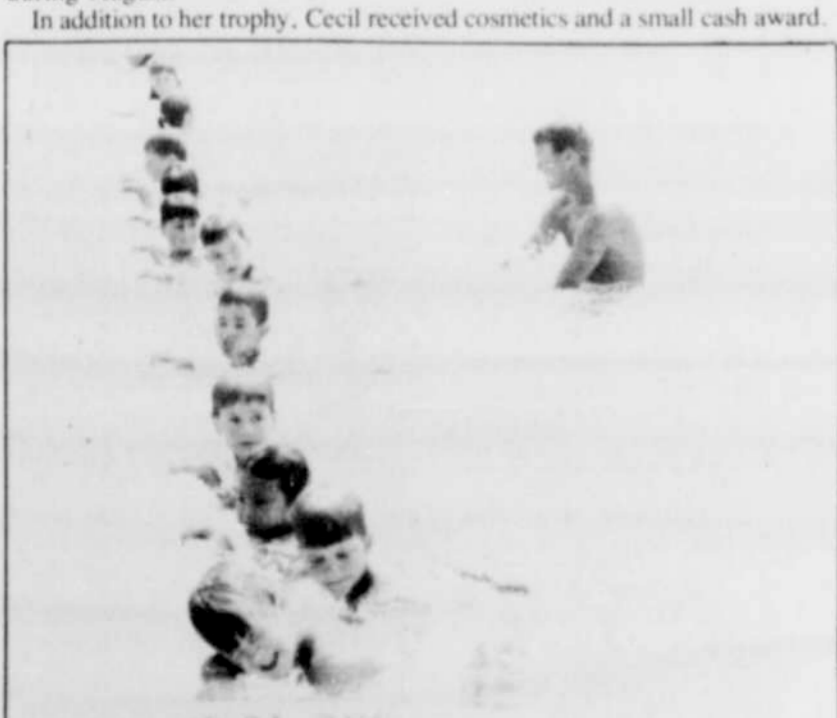
Lexington yard honored
