Area students attend business week

More than 700 Oregon high school students will spend a week of summer vacation learning about their futures in business.

Along with 70 of their teachers, they will be participating in the eighth-annual Oregon Business Week program on the Monmouth campus of Western Oregon State College. Each will attend an expense-paid scholarship provided by more than 500 businesses, organizations and individuals.

Conducted during two week-long sessions beginning August 2 and August 9 this year, OBW 1987 utilizes a faculty of volunteers from the Oregon business community to explain the roles of business in society, the personal freedoms provided by the American enterprise system and how to prepare for careers in business.

The program also offers hands-on management experience through a week of computer-simulated business decision-making.

Little League finishes fourth

The Willow Creek Little League All-Stars recently returned with a fourth-place from the District 5 Little League Tournament held July 22-25 in Hood River.

Fourth place is one of the top finishes for a Willow Creek All-Star Team.

Below is a recap of the tournament action for Willow Creek:

Wednesday, July 22

The Willow Creek All-Stars opened tournament action against the All-Stars from Sisters. Willow Creek pounded out 23 hits enroute to an 18-0 win. The winners were paced by a 5-5 hitting performance by Ryan Adelman. Deacon Heideman pitched 6 strong innings to get the win for Willow Creek, scattering 7 hits and was supported by a good defensive effort. Scott Coe doubled twice off the fence for the winners.

Thursday, July 23

The Willow Creek All-Stars met the Columbia All Stars from Boardman, Irrigon, Umatilla, Stanfield and Echo, and came from behind for an 11-8 victory. Willow Creek fought back from an 8-0 deficit, scoring four runs in the top of the sixth inning for the victory.

Scott Coe pitched four innings, in a strong relief performance, for the win and Steve Hoffman pitched the sixth inning for the save. The 17 hit attack was led by Deacon Heideman with a pair of two-baggers and Coe, Sam Sumner and Hoffman each recorded three hits.

Friday, July 24

The Willow Creek All-Stars ran into a buzz saw against The Dalles and lost 24-2. The Dalles recorded 21 hits and the locals booted the ball nine times in the loss.

The only offense Willow Creek produced was a double by Rick Koffler and a single by Shane Munkers.

Saturday, July 25

The consolation final pitted Willow Creek against the neighboring Hermiston All-Stars. Hermiston scored an 8-2 victory.

Steve Hoffman went the distance for Willow Creek on the mound in a gutsy performance. Hoffman also blasted a double for one of three Willow Creek hits.

Manager Kim Gutierrez and Coach Loran Heideman cited David Wagenblas, Peter Pearson, Sam Sumner and Steve Hoffman for strong defensive play during the tournament.

Leading hitters for the tournament included Ryan Adelman, 5-8 .625, Deacon Heideman 6-10 .600, Mike Walborn 3-5 .600, Rick Koffler 4-7 .571, Scott Coe 6-11 .545, Sam Sumner 5-11 .454 and Steve Hoffman 4-10 .400.

Gutierrez gave special praise for the team effort during game two when they stuck together and rallied to win despite being behind early.

Hood River beat The Dalles 6-5 Saturday night to win the tournament and will represent District 5 at the state tournament held in Hermiston August 3-8.
