**Phoebe Ann Hayes**

Phoebe Ann Hayes, a former Boardman resident, died July 21, in the Good Samaritan Center in Hermiston. She was 84.  
Born Dec. 4, 1902 in Lone Rock, Ore., Mrs. Hayes lived in Boardman for 38 years. Before moving to Boardman, she worked as a rural mail carrier for eight years delivering mail between Condon and Lone Rock.

She and her husband, Walt, owned the Red and White store in Condon for 10 years and the Hayes Grocery Store in Boardman for many years.

An avid golfer, Mrs. Hayes made a hole-in-one in 1974 at the age of 72. She was a member of the Boardman Community Church, the Order of Eastern Star, the Boardman Garden Club and the Boardman Golf Club.

Funeral services were held Friday in the Burns Mortuary Chapel with burial in the Heppner Masonic Cemetery.

She is survived by one son, Jeff Hayes of Maupin, Ore.; two daughters, Margaret LaTrace and Betty Putnum both of Hermiston; a sister, Roxie Lovgren of Heppner; nine grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren.

**Road Report**  
Public Works Director Phil Aikman

The Morrow County Public Works Department will again be providing a "Road Report" on the maintenance and construction activities of the public works department as a whole. The "Road Report" will be published every two weeks with special reports, as they occur, during the interim week.

During the last few weeks the road crew has been busy on Wilson Road doing Right of Way work in preparation of scheduled reconstruction in October. Planning and study of an engineering contract on Paul Smith Road is being done. However, no construction has been set.

The road crew has completed hand patching and blade patching on: three miles of the Lone-Gooseberry Road; four miles of the Dry Fork Road and eight miles of the Valby Road. Seal coats, Light Bituminous Surface Treatment, chip seals, will follow on Valby and Dry Fork this week, and Gooseberry Road next week.

Eighth Street in Irrigon was given two lifts of oil rock, L.B.S.T. Also, the road crew has been busy with parking lot and helipad work for the county hospital. Other special projects include: bank cuts for sight-distance at the Columbia Street Interchange in Boardman; trenching at the Turner Landfill; dust control, palliative applied on the Upper Rhea Creek Road; emergency repair on Ella Road made necessary by rain storm surface runoff.

Shoulder preparation work has begun on 14 miles of Big Butter Creek Road. Starting next week major reconstruction of this road will begin. The old asphalt will be reprocessed into base material, the shoulders widened and reconstructed, additional gravel base and top courses added and the alignment regraded. A base life of 3/4" L.B.S.T. then will be laid, followed by a wearing course of 1/2" L.B.S.T. (oil rock). Public cooperation during this project is very much needed to minimize delays and meet our extended work schedule.
