**June unemployment rate down slightly**

Morrow County's unemployment rate edged down just slightly in June. Both employment and unemployment levels were lower, with unemployment dropping just slightly faster.

Employment in the important food processing sector stayed level with May's figures. Farm employment was stable from May to June, and was running ahead of last year's levels.

Wage & salary employment fell in

several sectors including trade and government. The loss in government employment was due to normal seasonal losses in school related employment. The outlook for the rest of the summer should be for relative stability in the county's unemployment rate, allowing for the usual seasonal surge upward when the food processors close down for their semi-annual maintenance period in late July
