

Mustang stampede crushes Tigers

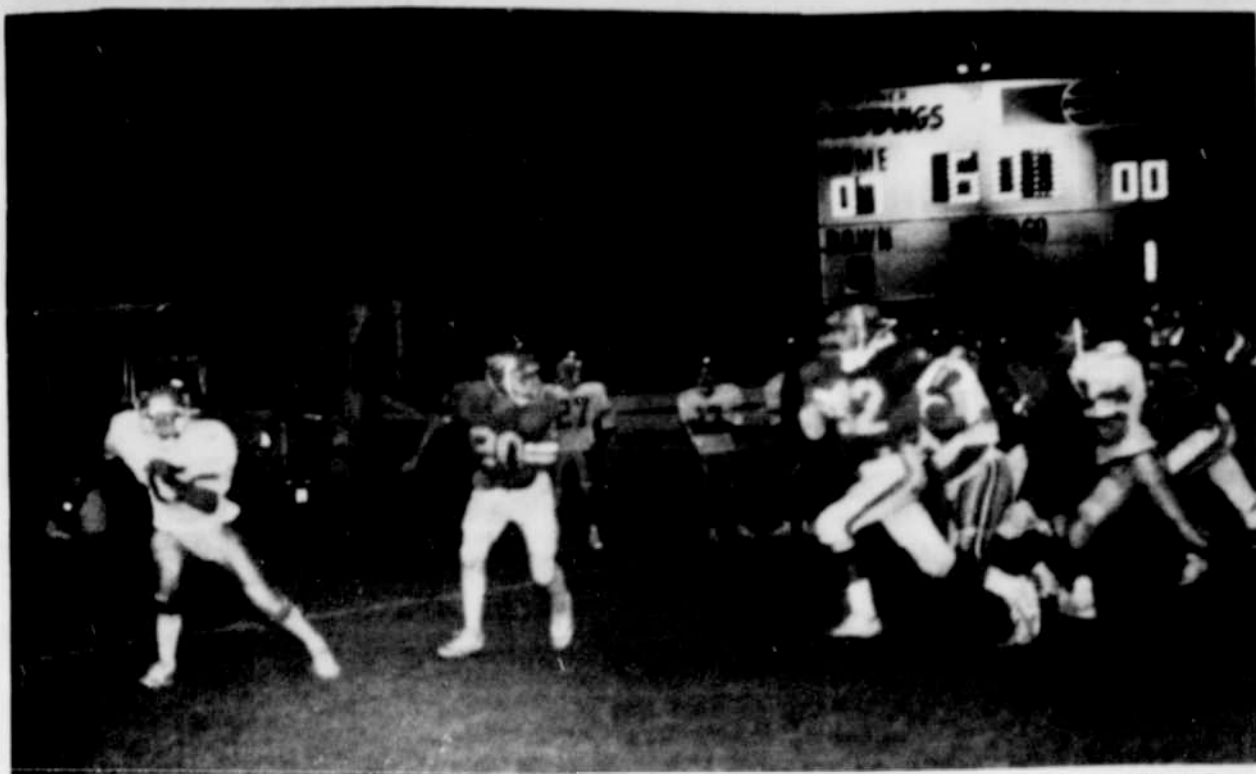

Heppner High football coach Tim Birkby finally accomplished his goal in beating the Stanfield Tigers 21-6. It was his first win over the Tigers in three years as head coach for the Mustangs.

Senior tailback Scott Jones jumped started the Mustangs as he scored from 34 yards out on only the sixth play from the line of scrimmage.

The Mustangs then stopped the Tigers' offense after only gaining one first down, then forcing them to punt.

The next play the Mustangs pitched left to CBC leading rusher, sophomore Russell Britt as he found daylight through the defensive

secondary for 45 yards. Later on in the possession the Mustangs' quarterback Dick Devin ran to the right, on the option, as flanker back Bryan Padberg followed gingerly, when Devin got hit, he turned and pitched to the speedster Padberg who streaked in from 30 yards out.

Place kicker Craig Angell, scoring both of the extra points, made the score 14-0 at the end of the first quarter. The red-hot Mustangs had a sizzling 15.3 yards rushing.

Near the end of the second period, the Mustangs again found themselves in scoring position after a 14 yard strike from Devin to Angell. The next play, Devin con-

nected with Dwayne Ball for a one-yard touchdown pass to end the first half 21-0.

In the second half, the Mustangs received the kick-off but could not convert the first down.

The Mustangs were forced to punt, but a badly snapped ball ended up in Stanfield's hands in scoring position. After an incomplete pass and a two-yard run, Tiger quarterback Shawn Martucelli rolled left and scampered in from 32 yards out as the extra-point kick was blocked by Ball and Jesse Jeffreys. That concluded the scoring of the

game 21-6.

The Mustang defense was very dominating having seven people with double figures in defensive points. The team was led by defensive end Barney Lindsay and by linebackers Jeffreys and Scott Davis. The defense forced four turnovers. Two fumbles were recovered by nose guard Jones and senior tackle Terry Gray. Secondary Devin and Britt each intercepted a pass.

The offensive line was credited by Birkby for making the gaps for the backs and giving time in the passing game. The line includes center Doug Marlatt, guards Jeffreys and Gray, and tackles Davis and 270 pound senior Gene Lancaster.

The Mustangs next opponent will be Morrow County rival Riverside Pirates who are 0-2. Heppner will have to stop the potent running game of the Pirates, led by Senior running back Rick Holden who has already been over the 100 yard mark this season. The game is scheduled for September 25 at Boardman.
