Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office at the Courthouse in Heppner reports handling or dispatching the following business during the past week:

Road Report

September 21 to October 2
The Morrow County Public Works Road Department completed two miles of the Big Butter Creek Road project, including asphalt reprocessing, subgrade compaction, shoulders widened, additional top course gravel added, and a prime-course asphalt surface treatment with a second course of 1/2-inch oil rock. The six miles previously reprocessed has been under compaction and will begin asphalt surfacing next week, following repair of the Road Department Chip Spreader machine.

On the North End the crew has done some patching on Frontage Road and Eighth Street, and spent a good deal of time mowing weeds and

brush in the Boardman area. Repair of the mowing machine delayed the completion of this work. The North End crew completed the installation of drainage culvert across Wilson Road, as part of that project. Fencing, roadway clearing and grubbing Right-of-Way work continues on this project. Last week the North End crew filled in on the Big Butter Creek project during the asphalt treatment operation for two days. In addition, weed mowing and brush cutting on Kunze Road and Tom Camp Road completed that week.

In the South End area patching work progressed last week on the lone-Boardman and East Baseline Roads. Drainage ditch work is in progress in the Heppner High School vicinity. Special projects that have been active are the County Hospital parking lot, the Annex in Heppner, sweeping the county airport runway, and completion of a Handicapped Fishing Access ramp and dock at Cutsforth Park, by an Irrigon Area contractor. The Road Department also began relocating the county rock crusher equipment to the Sandhollow area at a site on Jerry Dougherty's property. This site will be used to extract 20,000 cubic yards of crushed rock for future road work in that vicinity.
