

### Just say 'No'

Dutch Savage, a well-known public speaker and former professional wrestler, will speak to all of the students in the Heppner schools, Tuesday, Nov. 3, 1987. The theme of his presentation to the students will be based on his own experience as a former drug user. He will address correct decision making skills, conflicts caused by peer pressure, choices for a positive life style, and

the importance of a positive self-worth.

Mr. Savage will spend the morning at Heppner High School in a general assembly. He will also meet with the local SADD (Students Against Driving Drunk) chapter. The afternoon will be spent with a general assembly for grades 3-8. Immediately following he will speak with grades K-2.

The Parents' Club will be sponsoring Dutch for a special evening presentation provided for the community. This will take place at 7 p.m. at the Multi-purpose room at Heppner Elementary School.

Funds for this special program were presented to the Heppner schools by the Morrow County Juvenile Services Commission. This visit will be the first of a series of three that will be presented.

### Tax statements mailed to owners

Counties will now mail property tax statements directly to the property owners as a result of legislation passed by the 1987 Oregon Legislature, according to the Oregon Department of Revenue. In the past, many property owners received a copy of their property tax statements from their mortgage company. The counties mailed the tax statements directly to the mortgage companies because they were responsible for paying the taxes. While the new law does not change the responsibility for paying the taxes, it does provide all property owners their property tax information in November.

Property owners who are responsible for paying their own property taxes should treat the tax statement as their tax bill and follow the payment instructions on the statement.

If property tax statements are not received by November 15, property owners should contact the tax collector of the county in which the property is located to request a statement.
