

Ione volleyball team has trouble with Culver bulldogs

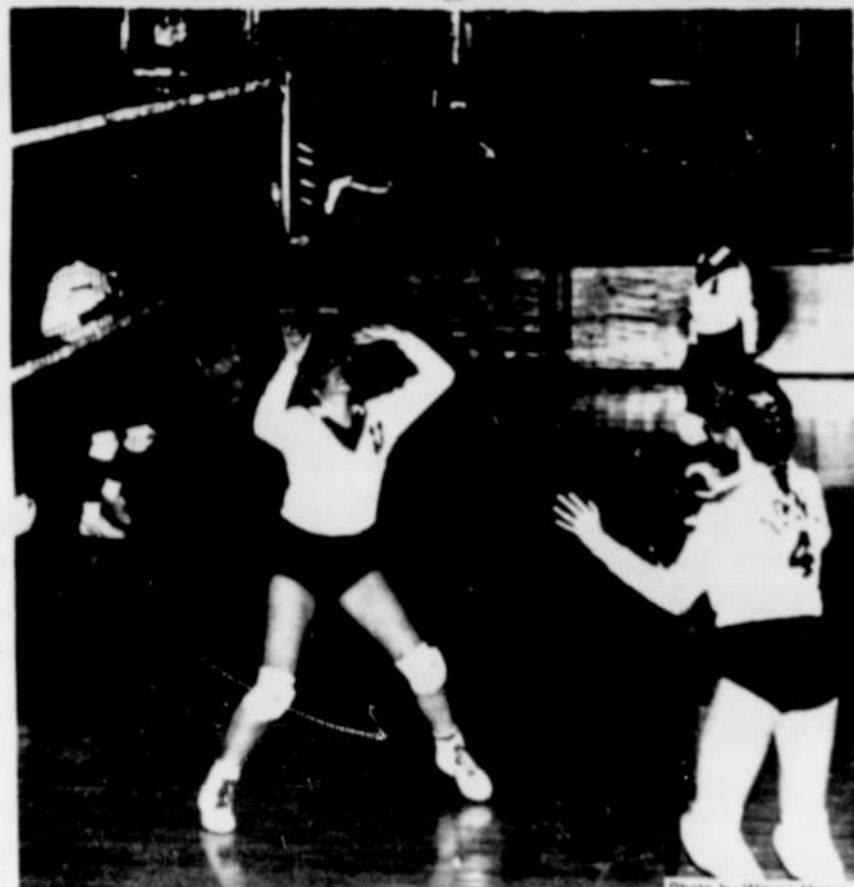

Despite the lopsided final score, the Bulldogs led the Cards by 100 yards in total offense.

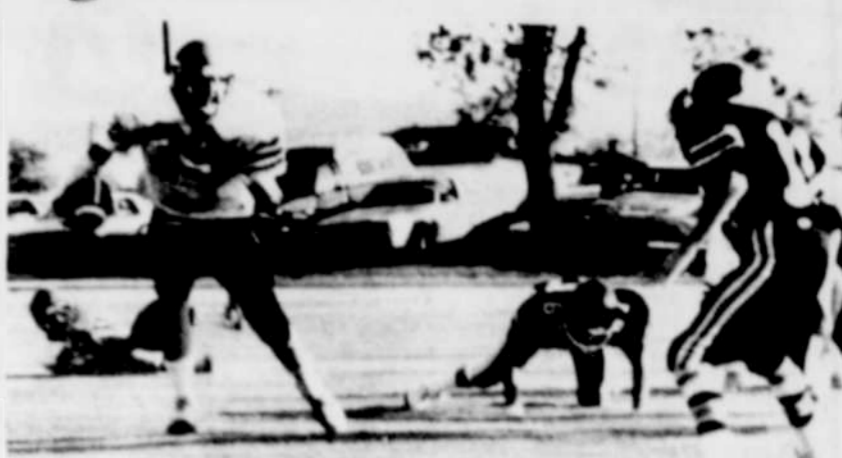
The final score of the game was 58-8 in favor of the Bulldogs.
