The Ione Cardinals hosted the Echo Cougars Friday, November 6 for the last game at the season that was also Ione's homecoming.

Echo's hopes of an undefeated season were riding on the game, as well as the added momentum of winning the game before the playoffs begin November 14.

Echo scored on the second play from scrimmage on a Dan Mcarty 33 yard touchdown scramble. Ione countered the run with junior tailback Dustin Padberg who scored on Ione's second play from scrimmage on a spectacular 80 yard run.

With the score being 6-6, Echo's high power offense took over with the high powered running combination of Mcarty and Neely, the starting Echo backs. Echo scored six straight times before Ione scored again with a 10 yard run by senior running back Kevin Ball.

The score at the half was 46-14 in favor of the Cougars. The Cardinals came back after the half by outscoring the Cougars in the third quarter by one point.

Echo took control of the fourth quarter scoring 18 points to nothing for the Cardinals.

The score at the end of the game was 72-22 in favor of Echo. The points by the Cards in the third quarter were also scored by Padberg on a 2 yard run with a conversion by Kevin Ball.

With this win, the Cougars went 5-0 in league play and 9-0 to the season. The Cougars, as the Big Sky champions open the State playoffs November 14 hosting Prairie City with a 7-1 league record and an 8-1 overall record. Prairie City closed out their season Friday by defeating Long Creek 54-28.

Playing their last game for the Ione football team were seniors Kevin Ball, Carl Bork, Gary Rea and Ken Snider.

Ball played almost the entire game as quarterback on offensive and safety on defense. He played well despite the lopsided final score.

Bork started at defensive guard for the Cardinals and finished playing very well by helping the defensive line stop the Echo offense on several key series.

Rea played the entire game as center offensively and did a good job giving Ball enough time to pass on several occasions when the Cards took to the air.

Condon started the game driving the entire length of the field for a touchdown after the successful

The final score of the game was 36-20 in favor of the Blue Devils. In spite of losing the game by 16 points the game was one of the most entertaining of the season for the large crowd that had gathered to watch it.
