The District Attorney's office at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner reports handling the following business for the past week:

Alberto Varelo Ruiz, Boardman-failed to appear for Change of Plea on November 10, 1987. Court ordered Bench Warrant.

Robert Coles, Heppner-appeared for arraignment on November 13, before Judge Ralph Currin for Failure to Appear on the charge of Failure to Display a Valid License. Entry of plea set for November 27. Defendant released on his own recognizance.
