## C-team wins final game

Heppner's C-team came out rip roaring and ready to go on October 27, and avenged an earlier league loss to Stanfield by winning 13-15, 15-6, 15-6.

Captain Amy Greenup winning the flip of the coin gave Heppner the option of first serve, which proved to be Heppner's power all night as the Fillies drove over the net 64-70 serves for 92% success.

Freshmen Jenni Weygandt and Melanie Gates gave the Tiger girls serves that weren't easily picked up as they went 5-6 and 8-9 in serving. Aggressive play by Jeanie Patterson, Amy Greenup and Lana Schmidt's front row play kept Heppner right in the thick of things but they could not gain control and lost game one 13-15.

It was another story as the Fillies went into game two knowing they had an earlier loss to avenge and needed a win to get into the third game of the match. As a team, Heppner successfully put 21-22 serves over for 96%. Tiffany Harrison belted over 6-6 as did Weygandt 8-8 followed by accurate underhand servers Tricia Coe and Candy Harris. Angie Currin and Weygandt added strength at the net. Stanfield had a difficult time on serve reception and Heppner easily took game two 15-6.

Freshman Jeanie Patterson was in the limelight of game three as she stepped back to serve 13-13 worth 11 points. Rebecca Wickland and Kristi O'Brien were ready in the front row as Harris, Greenup and Harrison were eager to scrape balls up from back row. Trying to salvage

a win, Stanfield continued to insert legal J.V. players, but the Filly girls prevailed with a great serving night. Heading the way for Heppner was Weygandt who turned in a fine match in front row play and serving 19-21, 16 points followed by top serving of Patterson 13-13, 11 points, Harrison 11-11, 6 points, and Gates 7-8, 7 points.

C-team coach Susie Hisler said "We got a little stagnant in game three and when they (Stanfield) started rotating in better J.V. players in game two and three I was a bit disappointed in their strategy. Legally I can use any of my J.V. players but Harrison, Weygandt and Greenup all freshmen were mainly floaters for our J.V. squad at the end of the season. Other teams weren't bringing down freshmen J.V. players. I could have used Niki Brisbois too and never did. Our C-team only had six league games and ended with a good 4-2 record. Only playing 7 matches the entire season. They lost to Grant Union, a volleyball powerhouse, 16-14, 13-15, 7-15 in non league. "They were a fun bunch to work with."

The Heppner Mustangs were eliminated from the state A playoffs in the first round as they lost to their host, Grant Union Prospectors 26-0.

The Heppner defense had a good first half allowing the Prospectors to score only once, but as the game went on, the defense wore down and the Prospectors scored 20 points in the second half.

Grant Union held the Mustangs to 55 yards in total offense. Russell Britt and Scott Jones led the offense with 76 yards combined.

Heppner ended the season well with eight players making first team all-conference, seven second-team and three honorable mentions. Two running backs placed in the top ten

of the Columbia Basin Conference in rushing, they were Britt and Jones.

In the league the Mustangs offense was fourth and the defense finished in first place overall.

"I was proud of the team for getting this far. They did it as a unit. The defense did very well, but Grant Union finally wore them out," Tim Birkby said.
