Greens workshop to be held Dec. 5

The Heppner Garden Club's annual greens workshop is an established feature each first Saturday in December during the Artfactory. At the club's November meeting, November 17, in the home of Gladys Jewell, workshop committees were announced and work assignments were given out following a talk by County Agent Fred Lundin.

Lundin spoke about composting, the using of organic mulches to improve gardens. He stressed that a good mulch can reduce soil packing, suppress weeds and keep soil moist and better regulated. He encouraged questions and gave out Extension Service bulletins which contain many facts about building bins for compost and handling and applying compost and also using plastic coverings to improve gardening.

Martha Doherty, garden club president, stressed that help will be needed through December 5. This year daytime and evening work meetings will take place in the Heppner Fireman's Hall on the corner of West Willow and Gale Streets.

County residents who wish to have a wreath or swag made by the gardeners should place an order now, well ahead of December 5, by

telephoning Ida Farra at 676-9446. Carefully made wreaths of fresh evergreens will be trimmed with a large, red ribbon bow, pine cones and several ornaments. They will sell for \$10 and are to be picked up at the Artfactory. Door swags of the same materials will sell for \$8. There will be some attractive table pieces for sale that day.

Those persons who wish to make their own evergreen ornaments may come to the Greens Workshop during Artfactory hours at the county fairgrounds where they may purchase all the things they will need to put their wreaths or swags together, including wire, ribbon bows, and trimmings at very nominal prices.

Those who wish to construct their own green ornaments are alerted to bring along garden clippers and gloves. If they have wire wreath bases, wrapping wire, ribbons and ornaments they have used before, they may bring them to use again.

As another of its several significant community services, the Heppner Garden Club provides the greenery cones, workspace and some guidance for individuals. Folks are encouraged to come early on Saturday as there is a limited area of workspace available.

Heppner Ranger District holds open house
