### Knowledge Master Open reports

Teams of students from Riverside High School, Heppner High School and Heppner Junior High competed in a grueling test of academic prowess December 2 in the National Knowledge Master Open, an academic competition involving hundreds of schools across the nation.

The local teams were quite pleased with their scores. Riverside and Heppner placed 7th and 8th in Oregon, just behind Hermiston. Heppner High was 18th of 22 teams last spring and improved to 8th of 16, ahead of many schools with much larger enrollments. Heppner Junior High School scored 9% more points and improved three places in the standings to 13th place. Riverside scored 1128, Heppner High scored 1063, and Heppner Junior High scored 851.

The contest was run on Apple II computers which tallied the students' scores based on speed and accuracy. The computers allow all schools the opportunity to compete in a national academic contest without the expense of traveling to a central site.

The Knowledge Master Open was developed to stimulate interest and to recognize academic achievement.
