

Twenty five pounds of marijuana seized by Task Forces

On February 5 the Morrow and Umatilla County Drug Task Forces executed a search warrant on a residence and property approximately 2 miles East of Hermiston. This resulted in the seizure of approximately 25 pounds of marijuana.

An investigation of two Irrigon men led to the search warrant which was executed by 18 police officers from the Oregon State Police, Morrow County Sheriff's Department,

Umatilla County Sheriff's Department and Pendleton Police Department. Several arrests are pending as a result of the investigation. No arrests have been made at this time, according to the Morrow County Sheriff's office. The marijuana was located hidden in a vehicle on the property. The estimated street value of the marijuana is \$50,000 and was in the form of a large compressed bale.

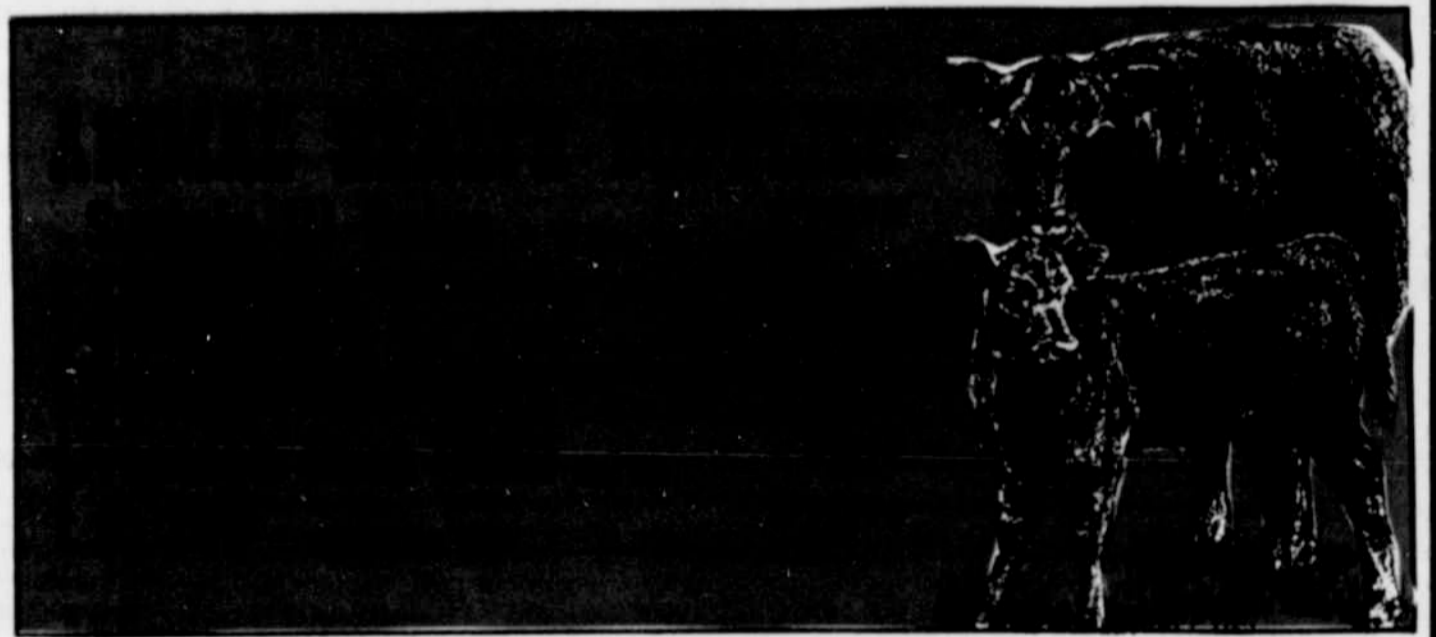
