This Saturday and next, there will be one day pheasant shoots at TREO offering a continental breakfast at Kate's Pizza, a steak BBQ, and of course lots of good bird hunting. Feb. 27 and March 5 & 6 there will be a quail shoot.

The pheasant shoot cost \$165 per person, and the quail shoot is \$95 per person.

When business gets rolling Carlson will be booking in hunters on packages that range up to \$550 for a three day stay. We will provide everything at that price, said Carlson. They can walk in here with a suitcase and we will provide the clothes, guns, everything.
