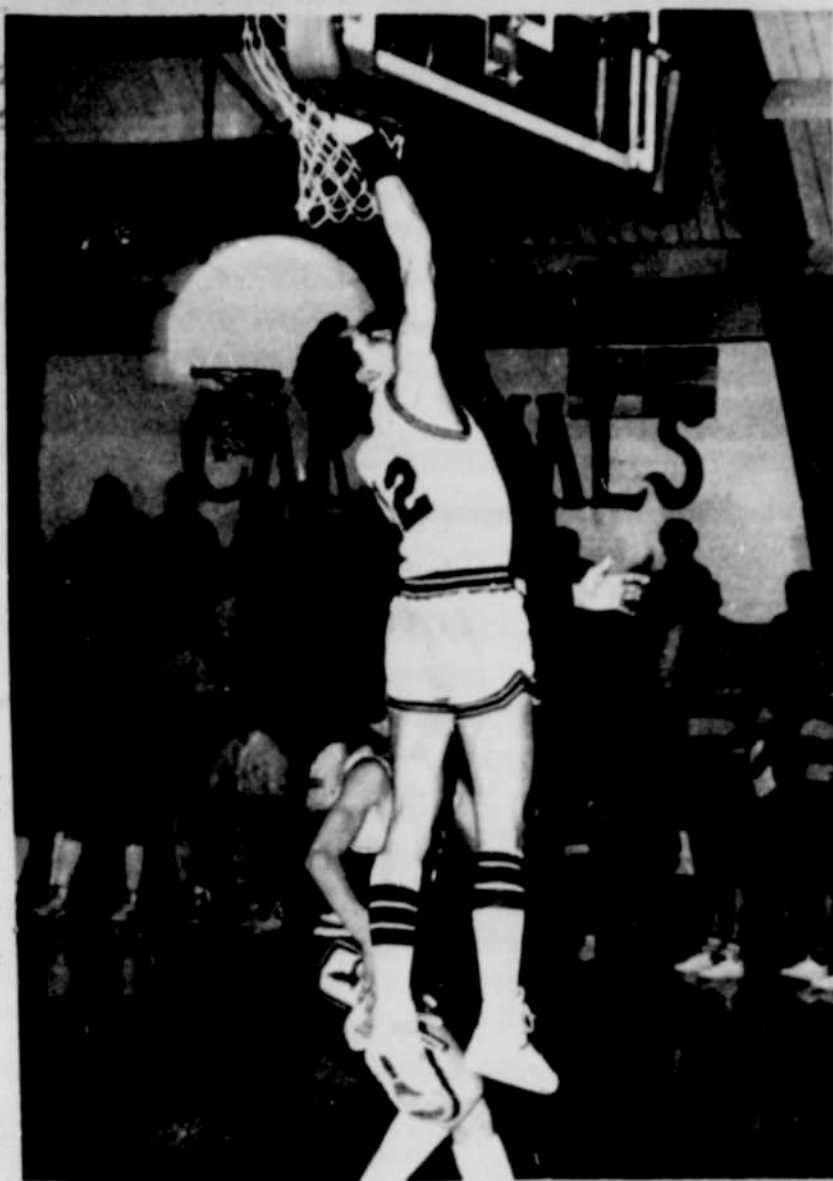


Falcons beat Ione boys

CAPTION (10 Words): One year operating levy.

QUESTION (20 Words): Shall the District levy \$6,077,567 outside its tax base for operational purposes in 1988-89?

EXPLANATION (150 Words): The Morrow County School District has a tax base of \$937,992 and the authority to levy a serial levy of \$366,736, for a total of \$1,304,728. This sum, plus non-tax revenues, is not enough to balance the budget and operate the district for the fiscal year 1988-89. The purpose of the \$6,077,567 levy is to raise enough money to operate the county's schools throughout the 1988-89 school year. This levy amount will be 3.5% above the 1987-88 total levy amount.

CAPTION (10 Words): ONE YEAR LEVY OUTSIDE TAX BASE.

QUESTION (20 Words): Shall the City of Heppner levy \$21,039.00 outside the tax base for operating purposes for 1988-89?

EXPLANATION: The current tax base of \$177,313.00 is inadequate for the general operation of the City. The City of Heppner requires property tax revenues to operate, and any tax levy outside the 6% limitation requires voter approval. The total amount necessary for operating purposes for the fiscal year 1988-89 is \$208,991.00. The total is \$21,039.00 greater than the tax base plus 6%. The increase is necessary for payroll costs, insurance, materials and supplies for operation and maintenance of the City of Heppner.
