The Community Action Program of East Central Oregon (CAPECO) has donated \$5,000 to the Heppner Neighborhood Council for 1988 for administrative expense.

CAPECO serves as an agency that distributes monies from grants from the federal government to eligible agencies. One of these grants is the Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP).

CAPECO is made up of one-third elected officials, one-third representatives of low-income persons, and one-third representatives from the community, business and religious interests.

The officers of CAPECO are Glenn Youngman, Umatilla, Dave Hampton, Heppner, and Elmo

Bloom, Hermiston. The elected officials are Youngman, Louis Carlson, Heppner; John Brenne, Pendleton; and Laura Pryor, Condon.

Representing the low income persons are Bloom; Jane Hewitt, Milton-Freewater, Jean Dillon, Irigoin; Sondra Kerby, Pendleton; and Cal Giesler, Arlington.

Business, community and religious representatives are Hampton; Keren Ceniga and Reggie Brown.

Also appointed chairmen of subcommittees are Hampton, finance; Hewitt, program planning assisted by Bloom; and Brown and Youngman co-chairing the personnel policies committee.

Coombs sentenced to nine years on charges

Simrall Coombs of Boardman was sentenced Friday, March 14, 1988 to nine years to the care and custody of the corrections division, following his conviction on sex-related charges.

Morrow County Circuit Court Judge pro-tem Richard Courson also fined Coombs \$20,000 and ordered him to make restitution to the

Childrens Services Division for the costs of treatment for the victim. The Court, in addition, ordered that Coombs undergo Sex Offender treatment prior to his release, be subject to a monitoring after his release, and have no contact with the victim or any females under the age of 18. The court also set bail at \$50,000 pending the Defendant's appeal of sentence.
