Long awaited Life Pack finally in place at PMH

The long awaited Life Pack has finally been installed in the Heppner ambulance.

The Heppner EMT's started over a year ago with the idea to purchase the pack for the ambulance as the one they were using was at times unavailable because the hospital had need of it, and they had first priority.

Many projects were organized to fund this project. A doll raffle, pool shoot, proceeds from CPR classes, Rolling Hills Run proceeds, helping the Lions Club sell fireworks and several donations from individuals were all combined to make up the \$2,000 the EMT's donated toward this end. The PMH Hospital Foundation contributed \$2,000 and the Morrow County Medical Board made up the difference of approximately \$4,000 to purchase this.

"We would like to thank the people that helped and donated for this very essential piece of equipment," EMT Carl Lauritsen was quoted as saying. "This will enable us to better do our jobs, and more effectively."

and used individually, according to the need. It comes with a battery pack charger unit that goes along with it. It is specially designed to take in an ambulance and is designed for carrying.
