D A's Report

The District Attorney's office in the Courthouse reports handling the following business during the past week:

Kurt Cate, 30, Irrigon-appeared for re-sentencing on the charges of Assault In the Fourth Degree and Robbery in the Second Degree, before Judge Ralph Currin, on April 1. He withdrew his guilty plea. No trial date has been set. Cate also appeared for sentencing on Game Violations which include, Waste of Game Mammal, Chasing Wildlife, Hunting Wildlife during prohibited hours and prohibited area, Hunting by a Motor-propelled Vehicle, Illegal Possession of Antlerless Deer, Hunting with the aid of Artificial Light, Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle, and Criminal Mischief in the First Degree.

Kent Cate, 30, Irrigon-appeared on April 1 before Judge Ralph Currin for entry of plea and plead not guilty to Chasing Wildlife, Hunting Wildlife during Prohibited Hours and Prohibited area, Hunting by a Motor-propelled vehicle, Criminal Mischief in the First Degree, and three counts of Waste of Game Mammal. Cate also appeared for Sentencing on Unrelated charges. Sentencing continued until completion of Pre-Sentence Investigation.

Jacob Frederick Shilts, 22, Benton County Jail-appeared for Arraignment on April 1 before Judge Ralph Currin on a Probation Violation. Entry of Plea is set for April 8.

Darwin Duane Cook, Jr., 31, Irrigon-appeared for Probation Violation on April 1 before Judge Ralph Currin. Defendant's probation was extended for one year to complete his court ordered financial obligations.

Patricia Eaton, 31, Vancouver, Wa.-appeared for Arraignment on the charge of Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants, before Judge Ralph Currin on April 1. Defendant will enter into a Diversion program.
