

GSH offers low-cost screening test

For the second year in a row, women in Good Shepherd Community Hospital's coverage area have the opportunity to receive a low-cost breast cancer screening test.

In cooperation with the American Cancer Society and radiologist Dr. Ralph Adams, Good Shepherd will offer mammograms for \$45 throughout the month of April to women who meet the Cancer Society's criteria. No doctor's referral is necessary, but an appointment is required. Appointments may be made by calling Good Shepherd's Diagnostic Imaging department at 567-6483.

The mammograms will be offered to all women age 35 and older who have not had a mammogram within the last five years, and who have not had breast surgery or an open biopsy in the last year. Pregnant women, and those nursing an infant, are ineligible for the program.

During last year's screening pro-

gram, Good Shepherd performed 190 mammograms, which are low-dosage X-rays of the breast. The ACS considers mammography the most effective method of locating breast cancer in its earliest stages.

Susan Ross, program coordinator for GSCH, said "we're very pleased to be able to participate in the program again this year. Last year's program identified seven women who were referred to their doctors for further evaluation—but more important than that, it provided baseline mammograms to 183 women who had no symptoms of abnormalities in the breast." Baseline studies, Ross explained, provide a record of normal tissue. "They serve as a comparison for later exams," she said.

In addition to the mammogram itself, the screening will include instruction in breast self-examination techniques. Women will also be urged to make sure breast examination is part of their regular yearly medical exams. Each participant will receive written notification of the results

of her mammogram, and a copy of the radiologist's report will be sent to her doctor, where it will become part of her permanent medical record.

The American Cancer Society estimates that one in 10 women will develop breast cancer at some time during her life. ACS figures indicate that early detection greatly increases the likelihood of successful treatment.

Food preparation demonstrations by experts will be headlined features at the Extension Homemakers Food Fair, Saturday, April 9, Thompson Hall, Hermiston. The special public event replaces the traditional end of year homemaker day for the two county area of Morrow and Umatilla counties. Doors open at 9:30 a.m. and the program ends at 3 p.m.

Featured demonstrations will be Diane Bryne, Oregon Beef Council who will lead off the date at 10:15 a.m. with "Beef Measures Up" demonstrations. She will repeat the demonstration at 1:30 p.m.

Have You Seen Julie Weflen?

The search continues for missing Bonneville Power Administration employee Julie Ann Weflen. Weflen was abducted on Sept. 16, 1987 while performing an unscheduled maintenance check at an unmanned power substation just west of Spokane, Washington. A struggle took place at the scene and Weflen's hardhat and sunglasses were found scattered on the ground. The van she had been driving was left with the doors and hatch open and her purse inside.

Efforts to find Weflen have included: extensive ground searches by authorities, Search & Rescue Units, Dog Teams, and hundreds of volunteers; air searches by helicopter and private planes; and water searches including use of boats and divers. Approximately 200,000 posters have been posted and sent out, 10,000 buttons bearing Weflen's picture have been handed out, and 73 billboards have been put up throughout Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana. But still no significant clues have been found.

A reward fund of \$80,000 has been established. If you have any information on the whereabouts of this missing woman, please contact Det.
