PMH blood drawing is April 20

Blood is needed by hospital patients 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

That's according to Sandi Hanna who is serving as coordinator of a Red Cross blood drawing scheduled for Wednesday, April 20 at Heppner Elks from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. The drawing is sponsored by Pioneer Memorial Hospital.

"The need for blood is ongoing," said Sandi. "Therefore, it is very, very important that people give blood on a regular basis. That way, the Red Cross will be able to efficiently provide life-sustaining blood when and where it's needed. After all, every 10 seconds, someone, somewhere needs blood."

The blood collected at Heppner will be transported to the American Red Cross Blood Services-Columbia River Region Blood Center in Yakima for testing, processing and packaging. From Yakima, the blood

is distributed to 31 hospitals in Central Washington and Northeastern Oregon.

The Red Cross collects blood only from voluntary donors. Donors must be at least 17 years old, in good overall health and weigh more than 110 pounds. People over age 65 are urged to give blood, and may do so without a doctor's permission. "In September we exceeded our goal of 50 units by 7 units of blood. Our goal for this drawing is 60 units. Please, everyone, come give the gift of life and make this drawing the best ever," says Hanna.

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, May 17, 1988, an election will be held in Morrow County School District, Morrow County, Oregon. The polls will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. The following shall be the ballot title for the measure submitted to the electors thereof:

CAPTION: (10 words): To Establish an Up-To-Date Tax Base.
QUESTION: (20 words): Shall Morrow County School District's tax base be increased in 1988-89 to \$8,612,025 from the current tax base of \$884,898?

EXPLANATION: (150 words): The district adopted the original Heppner School District's 1916 tax base, and that tax base has grown over the years to its present \$884,898 amount. This base represents less than 9% of the total funds needed to operate the district for one year.

The purpose of this measure election is to establish a realistic tax base of \$8,612,025 to meet the continuing needs of the district. This measure does not levy a tax. Instead, it updates a 72 year old tax base.

The budgeting process will continue to determine the actual amount of the tax base that will be levied to balance the budget.

If this measure is approved, the school district will be subject to the 6% Constitutional limitation and cannot exceed this limit without voter approval.
