Road Report

Work has continued on Wilson Road on the 3.5 miles of reconstruction to be completed by June 1988 with a new 28' oil mat.

In the last week, the road crew has completed the basing of the project with crushed rock being applied as a leveling course with the oiling to follow. Driveways are being built and will be oiled starting this week, weather permitting.

As the oiling program goes into full swing at the end of April or the first of May, traffic will be detoured during this process. The road department is asking for everyone's cooperation for the duration of this oiling.

Blade work continues on the roads in the south and southwest areas of the county even though conditions have been extremely dry for these roads. During the past weekend a good rain passed through the area helping greatly with the road conditions and crops.

The contract has been let for the drilling and shooting of 100,000 solid yards of rock at the Skinner Creek quarry site for the use on the Willow Creek road project. The rock crushing will start around May 15. The crushing is being done by Morrow County as their share on this reconstruction project.

The crusher is presently located north of Lone and will be completed at this site by the end of April.

The National Arbor Day Foundation presented Michael Bengé of Washington, D.C. formerly of Heppner, it's J. Sterling Morton Award. Honorees from 12 states, the District of Columbia, and Ontario, Canada were saluted for their distinguished accomplishments on Saturday, April 23, during Arbor Day Weekend celebrations.

Krebs sentenced to 30 years for 1985 robbery

John Krebs of Lone was sentenced Thursday, April 21, to 30 years in the Oregon State Penitentiary for his part in a 1985 bank robbery, according to Morrow County District Attorney Jeff Wallace.

In imposing the sentence, Circuit Court Judge Jack Olsen also ordered that Krebs serve a minimum sentence of 15 years before being released on parole.

The sentence follows Krebs' Guilty Plea to First Degree Robbery and First Degree Burglary. Krebs and a co-defendant, Richard Glen McCawley, robbed the Lone Branch of the Bank of Eastern Oregon at gunpoint in May, 1985. Following the robbery, the pair led police officers on a high-speed automobile chase before being captured at gun point.

At the time of the 1985 robbery, Krebs had escaped from the Oregon State Penitentiary, where he was serving a ten-year sentence for robbing

the same Lone Bank in 1983.

Krebs had previously plead guilty in August of 1985, to robbery and firearms charges arising from the 1985 robbery. However, the guilty pleas had been set aside by a Marion County Circuit Court Judge in a post-conviction relief action on the grounds that there was "no factual basis" for his guilty plea to the firearms charge. Under a 1985 plea agreement with then-District Attorney Richard J. McNeer, Krebs had plead guilty to Robbery in the

First Degree, and Inmate in Possession of a Firearm in a Penal Institution. Marion County Circuit Court Judge Greg West, in setting aside his guilty plea, noted that Krebs was not, in fact, in a penal institution at the time he committed the 1985 robbery because he was on escape status. He then remanded the case back to Morrow County Circuit Court for further proceedings, resulting in the most recent 30-year sentence.
