Morrow County Math contests held in Ione



Seventh and eighth grade math contest winners

Morrow County School District holds annual math contests for grades fourth through eighth. These are held in the spring, with schools alternating as hosts for the events. Students qualify by taking a test in their math classes. This test, as well as the tests used in the actual district contest, was developed by district math teachers to reflect the main skills that should be developed at each grade level.

The junior high contest was held Wednesday, May 11 at Ione. Karen Beck, math instructor and Linda Shaw, TAG coordinator, accompanied the math team from Heppner Junior High. Ryan Adelman of Heppner Junior High was the eighth grade champion. This win represents the second year in a row that Ryan has won
