Results of the write-in vote for County Commissioner (R), Jerry Anderson received 186 votes and Jerry Peck received 98 votes on the Republican ballot.

A correction was also made in the amount of votes for County Commissioner on the Democratic ballot for Morrow County Commissioner. Jerry Peck received 636 votes and Ted Sampson received 229.
