

Mustangs diamond men end season with third in CBC play

The 1988 Heppner baseball season came to a close Friday with a 4-2 decision over Weston-McEwen. The win put Heppner into a third place

season finish in the CBC Eastern division.

Junior Craig Angell provided the pitching while sophomore Russell Britt and seniors Scott Davis and

Mark Fishburn supplied the offensive punch as the Mustangs finished 9-7 in league and 10-9 overall.

Angell baffled the Tiger-Scots, holding them to just two hits, and striking out eleven. Seniors Scott Davis and Mark Fishburn playing in their final contest each contributed in a big way. Davis slammed a two-strike pitch over the right field wall for a two run homer in the first inning to give Heppner the early lead. Fishburn lined a lone triple to right field in the fifth inning. Russell Britt was the only player in the game to have two hits, one a run scoring triple in the second inning.

Four members of the Mustangs earned recognition on the All League Squad with Craig Angell (P), Russell Britt (IF), Scott Davis (DH), and Slater Mitchell (CF) all earning honorable mention status.

This season's offensive leaders were as follows: Batting average-Craig Angell .389; Bob Krein .357; Scott Davis .311. Runs-Craig Angell 16; Russell Britt 15; Mark Fishburn 12. Hits-Craig Angell 23; Russell Britt 16; Slater Mitchell 16. RBI-Slater Mitchell 11; Scott Davis 9; Dick Devin 9; Craig Angell 9.

City reduces proposed serial levy for landfill

The City of Heppner on May 2, approved a serial levy ballot measure to support the Morrow County Landfill. At that time, the proposed ballot measure would have requested revenues of approximately \$46,000 per year.

The Heppner Economic Development Commission reviewed the ballot measure and collected some information which they presented to the city council on May 16. The City, after reviewing this material, substantially reduced the proposed serial levy for the landfill to approximately \$27,000 per year. The major item included in the serial levy is purchase of a used caterpillar tractor for trenching and covering the garbage at the landfill site. The city had been using a cat provided by Morrow County which was too small to effectively compact the garbage and do trenching.

The serial levy does not include any of the items that have been included in the city's general budget for the last several years. However, the levy includes the cost of meeting

additional DEQ requirements such as additional water tests, permit fees for opening the new section of the landfill, and costs of building the new road into parcel "B" of the landfill. Also included are sums for fuels and repair for the cat which must be purchased.

The city plans to keep the landfill open until the Findley Buttes Landfill Site is in operation. The city will then have an alternative. If the landfill site is closed, all residents in south Morrow County will be forced to have their trash hauled to Hermon. They will have no input or control over costs of transportation or means of collection of garbage. Questions on the landfill operation should be referred to the Heppner Mayor, Cara Costa, or to any city council member.
