CAPTION (10 words): THREE YEAR LANDFILL OPERATION SERIAL LEVY

QUESTION (20 words): Shall the City of Heppner levy \$28,824.00 for three years outside the tax base for Landfill Operation beginning in 1988-89?

*EXPLANATION: The City must purchase equipment for trenching and backfill to operate the Landfill to standards required by the Department of Environmental Quality. \$28,824.00 levied each year for three years, providing a total of \$86,472.00 would enable the City to purchase the necessary equipment and would allow the City to operate the Landfill to the required standards. The estimated tax rate for the first year of the three year levy is \$1.13 per thousand. *The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County assessor at the time of the estimate.
