The Ione Swimming Pool will be open on Tuesday, June 21. Regular hours will be Tuesdays through Fridays from 2 to 5 p.m. and 7 to 9 p.m. The pool will be open on Saturdays and Sundays from 2 to 5 p.m. only. It will be closed on Mondays.

Fee schedule for 1988 will be as follows: Daily use: pre-school, free; Grades K-6 50¢; grades 7-12 75¢; Adults \$1. Season tickets: grades K-6 \$10; grades 7-12 \$15; adults \$20; family \$35.

Red Cross swimming lessons will run in two two-week sessions. The first session will be June 21-July 1, and the second will be July 5-15.

The cost of the swimming lessons will be \$4.
