D.A.'s Report

The District Attorney's office at the courthouse in Heppner reports handling the following business during the past week:

Jack Odell Bailey, 47, Troutman, North Carolina, appeared for sentencing on June 24, 1988, before Judge Ralph Currin, on the charge of Possession of Falsely Applied for Hunting License and Elk Tag. He was fined \$100.

Michael Brisco, 34, Irrigon, appeared for sentencing on June 24, 1988 before Judge Ralph Currin following a guilty plea to Criminal Trespass in the First Degree. Defendant was fined \$150, \$20 to Crime Victims Compensation Account, and \$10 to the Board of Police Standards and Training program. Restitution in the amount of \$62.79 to the victim. Defendant shall complete two years bench probation to the court.

Harold Ray Reital, 19, Umatilla, failed to appear for Entry of Plea on June 24, 1988 before Judge Ralph Currin. A warrant was issued.

Darrell Robertson, 21, Hermiton, appeared for arraignment on June 24, 1988 before Judge Ralph Currin on the charges of Three Counts of Criminal Conspiracy, Two Counts of Attempted Assault in the First Degree, and Attempted Burglary in the First Degree. Entry of plea is set for July 1, 1988.

Delray Hoke, 21, Pocatello, Id., appeared for arraignment on June 24, 1988 before Judge Ralph Currin on the charges of Two Counts of Attempted Assault in the First Degree, Three counts of Criminal Conspiracy and Attempted Burglary in the First Degree. Entry of plea is set for July 1, 1988.

Noxious Weed Strategies for Success

In this part of the country, nearly everyone is close to the land, or has a large stake in it.
