Gray appointed to Special Courts Advisory Committee

Chief Justice Edwin J. Peterson recently appointed Justice of the Peace Charlotte Gray to the Special Courts Advisory Committee, effective July 1. The term of the appointment is three years. She attended her first meeting in Salem on July 8. This committee is to be a liaison between Supreme Courts and Special Courts which include Municipal and Justice Courts. It is their job to help

the courts understand the problems encountered at the lower courts level.

The committee consists of two Municipal judges, two Justice of the Peace, one member of a city governing body and one member of a county governing body.

The committee meets about twice a year, more often if necessary.

Seventh grader qualifies for Nat'l competition

Len Brittrner of Heppner qualified May 22 for the Junior Olympics in the high jump and long jump. This qualified him for the State Junior

Olympics held in Hillsboro on June 25. He was awarded third place in the high jump but injured himself and could not compete in the long jump. From here he was on to Regionals at Salem on July 9 and placed second place with a jump of 4 feet 8 1/2 inches. Regionals included participants from Alaska, Montana, Idaho, Washington and Oregon. The top three go to National Competition in Florida. Len also qualified for Nationals last year but was unable to attend.

Len is 12 years old and a seventh grader at Heppner Junior High School. He is the son of Peggy Brittrner.

Phyllis Payne is his coach and she says Len is the only one from Heppner to qualify for Nationals in the 14 years she has been in Heppner.

Nationals will be held in Florida the end of July.

Two thousand dollars is needed for Len to attend the National Olympic meet, according to Len's mother.

The National Olympics will be held in Tacoma, WA, next year.
