Plaintiff's allege:

1
At all times material herein, plain-
tiffs were and now are husband and
wife, residing in the State of Oregon.

2
At all times hereinafter mention-
ed, defendants were husband and
wife and may be found in Umatilla
County, Oregon.

3
On the 17th day of April, 1986,
for good and valuable consideration,
defendants made, executed, and
delivered to plaintiffs their prom-
issory note, a true copy of which
is attached hereto as Exhibit "A"
and incorporated herein by
reference. Ever since, plaintiffs have
been and now are the sole owners
and holders of that note.

Pursuant to the terms of the pro-
missory note, defendants promised
to pay plaintiff the sum of \$3,008.22
in consecutive monthly installments
of \$119.77 beginning on the 26th
day of May, 1986, until paid.

Defendants are in default on the
note by reason of their failure to
make the payments required
thereunder, and plaintiffs have
declared the entire unpaid balance of
the note, \$2,117.73, immediately
due and payable.

Despite demands for the balance
owing, defendants have failed or
refused to pay the balance owing on
the note. As a result there is now due
and owing on the note from defen-
dants to plaintiffs the sum of
\$2,117.73, together with interest
thereon at 14% annum from the 29th
day of June, 1988 until paid.

The note further provides that in
the event suit or action is filed to col-
lect the note, defendants agreed also
to pay plaintiffs reasonable attorney
fees. Plaintiff has been required to
obtain the services of an attorney to
enforce this note.

WHEREFORE, plaintiffs pray for
judgment against defendants and
each of them in the amount of
\$2,117.73, together with interest
thereon at the rate of 14% per an-
num from the 29th day of June,
1988, until paid, for plaintiff's
reasonable attorney fee, and for
